

#### **Question #4**

Romans 12:13b says we're to practice hospitality; literally, to "pursue the love of strangers" (Heb. 13:2), not simply to hang out with our family and friends. Practising biblical hospitality demonstrates obedience to our heavenly Father.

In the story of Zacchaeus how did Jesus demonstrate biblical hospitality? What was the response? Why do you think that happened?

#### **Question #5**

How does this passage extend our view of hospitality involving more than meeting physical needs? In what way does this challenge your view of sharing the gospel?
