Question #1

Question #3

What does it mean to be a citizen of this kingdom?

Question #4

Read Luke 13:18-22

What have you heard about this passage before?

Question #5

As a citizen of the Kingdom of God, what might this passage be calling us to?

Question #6

What comes to mind when you think of the idea of "Kingdom Communities"?

Question #7

Have you seen any examples of a "Kingdom Community"? Biblical or otherwise.

Question #8

Why do you think we can find it so difficult to create these types of communities?

Question #9

How can you live out the parable of the mustard seed on a personal level, and also as a small group?
