GETTING STARTED

Q1. Share your favourite OLD testament Bible story.
Q2. Share your favourite NEW testament Bible story.
Q3. Why are these your favourites? Are there any similarities or relatable themes in these stories? Hint: These themes may be the beginnings of expressing your story of how you see God.

INTO THE WORD

Read Psalm 145:1-12

Q4. What might it look like to live out verse 2 that says "Every day I will praise you" (Consider reading **Romans 12:1** and **1 Peter 4:10-11** to help you as you discuss)

Q5. Write out, or share aloud all the descriptive words used in this psalm. Why do you think this psalmist shares so many?

Q6. In what way can you practically express (show & tell) His praise to the next generation in today's world?

Q7. What is one line from this psalm that you could work at doing today?

GOING DEEPER

Q8. Who is someone that you could invest in to pass the baton (gospel) on to? This could be someone who is not yet a Christian or a believer that you could journey alongside. Consider how you could start a conversation with them this week, and tell the group how that might look.

CONCLUSION & PRAYER

This series has emphasised the importance of passing the gospel on to the next generation – and not letting it die with us. As we read scripture and observe the things He has done let us not forget the importance of this task.

The power of our "faith-stories" will remain unseen unless God is seen for what He's done. Today consider how important it is that we pass our stories on to them – so that God can be glorified through it and that His name can be known from generation to generation.

Take time to pray for the next generation and the things they face.
