# **GETTING STARTED**

**Q1.** Can you think of a time when something terrible happened that God used for good?

**Q2.** When was the last time you spoke to someone about Jesus? What was that like?

### INTO THE WORD

If you want the entire picture, read Acts 7.

#### Read Acts 8:1-3

**Q3.** We know that life can be tough, these verses paint a picture of fear, sadness, and what could be the end of the church (v3). When have you felt that life is full of fear, sadness, and/or is without hope?

#### Read Acts 8:4-8

**Q4.** God uses what we would see as a tragedy to impact the world. The fear that scattered the Church was not greater than the desire to share the gospel with others (v4). How can we have a desire for the gospel that outweighs our fear? What are the fears that stop us from sharing the gospel?

## **GOING DEEPER**

#### **Read Acts 8:26-40**

**Q5.** Philip was a leader within the early church, we would see him as the equivalent of a ministry team leader. Philip was led by the Spirit throughout this passage. What stands out to you about the link to "hearing the Spirit" and Philip's actions as a response to the Spirit's leading? Is there something we can learn from Philip in how we can we respond to the Holy Spirit?

**Q6**. Acts 8:4 says that they "preached the word wherever they went". How can you preach the word wherever you go - in your actions, your thoughts, your generosity, your kindness, your love, and of course as you bear witness to God? (Acts 8:1)
