# THE BIBLE AT 3000 FEET: THE BIG PICTURE

**27 APRIL 2025**

Key Verses: 2 Timothy 3:16–17, Hebrews 4:12,  
Luke 24:27

## GETTING STARTED

The Bible is more than just a book—it's God's grand story and personal message to humanity. At 3000 feet, we can see how it all fits together: creation, fall, redemption, and restoration—all centred on Jesus.

### **Discussion Questions:**

- What has your relationship with the Bible been like recently—regular, occasional, or distant?
- When you think of the Bible as a whole, what words come to mind? Confusing? Life-giving? Overwhelming?

# INTO THE WORD

**2 Timothy 3:16–17** reminds us that all Scripture is God-breathed—from Genesis to Revelation. It's useful for teaching us truth, correcting us when we stray, and equipping us for every good work.

**Hebrews 4:12** shows us that God's Word is alive and active, able to cut through to the very core of who we are.

**Luke 24:27** gives us a glimpse of Jesus explaining that all Scripture ultimately points to Him.

## Discussion Questions:

- What do these verses say about the nature and power of the Bible?
- How do you think seeing the Bible as one big story about Jesus might change the way you read it?

# GOING DEEPER

The Bible is not a rulebook or random collection of writings—it's a unified story. Reading it with a “big picture” lens helps us grasp God's purpose and His heart. Begin by asking:

- What does this passage reveal about God?
- How does it connect to the larger story of Jesus?

Try reading whole books at a time, or using a Bible app plan (like YouVersion) that traces the story of Scripture.

## **Discussion Questions:**

- What's one way you can begin reading the Bible more consistently or intentionally this week?
- What part of the Bible do you want to understand better—and why?

Father, thank You for giving us Your Word. Help us to see the Bible not as a task, but as a treasure—alive and active, pointing us to Jesus. Teach us to read with understanding, to be equipped for every good work, and to love Your Word more deeply each day. Amen.
