GETTING STARTED

Think about your own life—what foundations are you standing on?

Some of us have inherited family traditions, land, or even values we didn't earn.

Spiritually, the same is true. The Bible reminds us that our faith is built on the sacrifices of those who came before us, but ultimately on Jesus, the solid rock.

INTO THE WORD

Read these passages:

- **Hebrews 12:1-2**
- **2 Timothy 2:2**
- **1 Peter 2:4-5**
- **Luke 24:5-6**

York Street's story reminds us that we didn't get here by accident. Families gathered in the 1890s with a simple desire—to know Jesus and make Him known. Through faith, service, and sacrifice, buildings were built, ministries began, and generations were discipled.

At times when others pulled back, York Street stepped forward in faith. Today we see the fruit: people coming to Jesus, opening His Word, and serving faithfully

But Scripture points us higher. Hebrews says we're surrounded by a "great cloud of witnesses" urging us to run with perseverance, fixing our eyes on Jesus. Paul tells Timothy to entrust the faith to others who will keep passing it on. Peter calls us living stones, built into a spiritual house for God's glory. And the resurrection declares that our hope isn't in buildings or history but in the risen Christ.

- What do you think it means to inherit a legacy of faith? How has that shaped your own journey?
- York Street's story shows courage and sacrifice. What moments of risk or faith have stood out to you in your walk with Christ?
- Hebrews 12 talks about "throwing off everything that hinders." What are some things you need to throw off so you can run the race with perseverance?
- Luke 24 reminds us that the centre of our legacy is the cross and resurrection. How can we keep Jesus at the heart of everything we build today?
- What kind of legacy do you want to leave for the next generation—both in your family and in our church?
